A Matter of Life and Death 6th November

We tend to avoid talking about death. It was Maggie Johnson's wish that we might do just that, so with her and Sue Jones I have been planning this event in Hawkley Village Hall on Wednesday 6^{th} November 2.30pm-4.00pm called, 'A Matter of Life and Death'.

With Maggie we had planned this opportunity to think and talk over tea and biscuits. Using a tried and tested method to get conversations started, around tables there will be cards with helpful questions – questions just to get us thinking and talking about this topic we so easily avoid. For some it is a really difficult subject and if people just want to listen that's fine – there will be no lectures – just an opportunity to think and perhaps ask more questions.

Sadly, now without Maggie who was going to help facilitate, Sue Jones and I will lead the afternoon using material called 'Grave Talk', to help start conversations. In addition to having conversations and just listening, there will be an opportunity to ask questions if you have them. You might have questions about the practicalities – what has to be done when someone we love dies? How do we organise a funeral and what could, or should, I be thinking about now. You might have questions about the nature of grief and grieving. Or about theology or belief. We may not have answers to every question – this is after all one of the big mysteries – but we'll do our best to start the process.

If the afternoon session goes well, we'll think about what kind of follow up would be helpful. That might be more gatherings like this one to talk in general terms or in future, to have opportunities to be more specific.

It would be really helpful to have a rough idea of numbers so if you plan to come do please let me know.

Toiletries: Toilet rolls and toiletries (children's toothpaste, deodorants, adult toothpaste, deodorants, razors (not Bic Yellow), shower gels, bubble bath and shampoos).

Morning Prayer and Reflections

Our current practice is to say Morning Prayer on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays at 0900 at Greatham and at 0730 on Wednesdays at Hawkley. Because of road closures in Greatham lasting 12 weeks we are going to trial a different pattern and to switch all of these services to Hawkley until the road works are completed. This will coincide with reintroducing Reflections on Monday mornings – for this same trial period.

The new pattern at Hawkley will be:

Mondays	0900	Reflections
Tuesdays	0900	Morning Prayer
Wednesdays	0730	Morning Prayer
Thursdays	0900	Morning Prayer

Reflections will begin with a very much shortened introduction of Morning Prayer followed by reading the readings for the forthcoming Sunday. The readings are followed by discussion about the readings. It is a great way of preparing for the coming Sunday and letting the words of readings sink into our subconscious in the coming days. No one has to join in with a discussion, just listening is encouraged as well!

Morning Prayer from Common Worship is the contemporary version of the morning daily office. It follows a pattern of introduction, psalm(s), readings, canticles including the Benedictus and prayers appropriate to the day. Currently up to 5 or 6 people might come – it is a great way to start the day and there is room for lots more!

Neither Reflections nor Morning Prayer will last for more than 30 minutes.

Some attendees of Morning Prayer, but by no means all, use the App on their phones for Morning Prayer which saves having to look up readings and psalms – it's all on the phone! How times have changed. Whether you come to church for this or not, have a look at this App – you can, of course use it anywhere!


